Understanding China Series Event 4 ÒPolicy Storms: Understanding ChinaÕs Education Market & State Through Recent Policy Changes

In recent years and especially in 2021, new, strict regulations promulgated by the Chinese government hammered a number of industries, such as education merce, real estated even entertainment. These policy changes have proven detrimental to the the top rofit supplemental education industry, and are likely to have profound consequences for the Chinese economy and sociegeneral. This presentation draws on these policy charges we current conditions in ChinaÕs education, market and state sectors.
